Springfield Branch Spotlight: People for Safe Water

People for Safe Water (PfSW) is a local environmental action group fighting for the complete cleanup of a Hazardous Waste Barrel Fill (Dump) located in Clark County, OH. This 8-acre site holds over a million gallons of hazardous industrial waste put there in the 1970's, and sitting in deteriorating 55 gallon drums in unlined pits. The critical issue is that this site sits directly over the sole source aquifer that supplies water to more than 82,000 people. It sits just 3 miles from Springfield's well heads.

Because of the impact to the health and wellbeing of people of Springfield and Clark County, PfSW has been fighting for a complete and effective cleanup with some of the biggest most powerful corporations in the county. Working with USEPA, Ohio EPA, local, state, and federal representatives, we are doing battle and learning how difficult it is to effect changes for the good of people when powerful financial issues are at stake. Learn how PfSW and some local AAUW members have been able to hold off corporate giants and the USEPA to keep Springfield from becoming the next Flint MI.



Her work involves creating innovative programs for underprivileged youth, encouraging resident-led approaches to safety, food access & engagement, and convening community partners to advocate for a unified and multi-faceted approach to generational poverty. She has helped the organization receive over \$500,000 in revenue, managed programs that serve over 100 children, and produced numerous publications. Kali also conducts the handbell choir at Northminster Presbyterian Church and serves yummy taco creations at Guerra's Krazy Taco. In her "free time," Kali enjoys exploring the numerous parks and nature preserves the area has to offer and practicing her photography skills.

By breaking the uncontested reality, Dr. Yagnik urges his readers and others to explore their world and existence with magnitude and intensity necessary to reach a certain phenomenon, reaction or result by attaining a philosophy/approach/attitude, he calls as- 'Simple living and high thinking'.

Most find his approach of simple life too difficult, mostly due to his perpetual preference of warm water over coffee, finding home for a stray kitty in the middle of a night, or stopping in freezing temperatures to take pictures of beautiful skies- only because they were a different shade of blue. Only a couple years ago, it took the entire Bowling Green community to convince Dr. Yagnik to sell his beaten down 90's BMW, he endearingly called the 'Pope Mobil' since he failed to see it as unusable. Few years ago, he notched the approach a little higher by maintaining on forever quitting at least one significant food item from his life each year, lest he became too addicted to it. Yet, he sometimes questions why others often call him distinctive and atypical.

Her research interests are cultural and social issues of the family and learning outcomes assessment.
